Their conversations with staff left a great impression, showcasing their readiness to navigate the professional world. I wanted to extend a further thank you to those students who went the extra mile, dressed in suits and professional attire. #### **Year 12 Work Placement Monday 15th - Friday 19th July**

Why is work experience important? There is so much competition for university places, apprenticeships and jobs. Good grades are important but they are not the complete picture. This is an excellent opportunity for students to build some experience and demonstrate their personal qualities within the workplace. Students will gain transferable skills that they will take with them on their next steps. All Year 12 students are expected to find a work experience placement. If students are struggling to find one, they can receive support and guidance from Miss Kenny in the Sixth Form office. The process - Students must complete the relevant Work Experience form on Unifrog. Their chosen employer will then need to fill out their relevant section of the form which will be emailed to them directly. The employer must have public liability insurance and be able to provide these details on the form, otherwise the placement will be denied. Once the placement is confirmed students will need to arrange an initial meeting with the company to confirm start / finish times etc.



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We will officially launch Work Placement after the Easter Holiday and send home further information.
