# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

It has been good getting back to normality after our Ofsted inspection last week. I have received the report in a draft format, but the approval process can be slow – hopefully it should be published within the next 2-3 weeks.

Thank you to everyone who participated in our consultation regarding changing the timings of the school day for the next academic year. All students and parents have been given the opportunity to respond. The staff consultation period has been extended until next Wednesday due to the time lost when the Ofsted inspectors were in. I should be able to announce the results in next Friday's bulletin.

As usual, the better weather and lighter nights coincide with exam season starting for our students! I had the privilege of looking round the GCSE and A level Art work last night with Ms Lewis. We have some excellent artists in the school and that is reflected in the high calibre of work that the students are producing. All other students also have end of year exams which take place at the following times:

**Years 7 and 8** – week commencing 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> May (English/maths/science exams in Sports Hall - all other assessments in classrooms)

**Year 9** – week commencing 3<sup>rd</sup> June (English/maths/science exams in Sports Hall - all other assessments in classrooms)

**Year 10** – week commencing 17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> June (Full set of trial exams in the Sports Hall)

**Year 12** – week commencing 1<sup>st</sup> July

Please take a note of these dates and encourage your child to begin revising if they have not already done so. The assessments are used to decide initial class sets for the next academic year so it's important that the students treat the assessments seriously and do some focussed revision from this point onwards.

#### Ski Club places available – Year 7 & 8

We are pleased to be able to offer more places on PGS Ski Club to our Year 7 and 8 students.

The sessions have currently been running once monthly since January at Snozone Yorkshire. All students will be coached and supported at a pace that suits them, led by expert, fully qualified coaches, in the safest and most enjoyable way to learn and practice skiing. The aim of this club is to make the experience of skiing more accessible to those students who are NOT attending the Ski Trip to Austria in February 2025. If your child has a place on the Ski Trip, they will be visiting Snozone Yorkshire in January 2025, which is why the club is only open to those who do not have a place on the trip.

We have places available in each group; costing £16.66 per student, per session or a discounted rate for PPA / CLA children. As we have 4 groups with places available, we will be running the groups every four months once your child has been given a group. For example,
